Paddington Trio

The Paddington Trio is one of the most exciting chamber ensembles of their generation, known for their fresh interpretations and energetic performances. Comprising Finnish violinist Tuulia Hero, Irish cellist Patrick and American Moriarty. pianist Stephanie Tang, the trio has made London their home, much like the famous bear from whom they take their name. Their mission is to bridge the between new listeners classical music enthusiasts, creating an inviting space for musical discovery.

Since its founding in 2020, the trio has been awarded prizes at the Royal Over-Seas League Competition, Triomphe de International Competition, Storioni Concours, and the Parkhouse Award at Wigmore Hall. In 2023, they made their concerto debut performing Beethoven's Triple Concerto in Finland. Recent international appearances have TivoliVredenburg, taken them to Wigmore Hall, and Festival Flanders Ghent. Supported by organizations such as the City Music Foundation, the trio mentors and inspires young ensembles their artistic in development.

The Paddington Trio worked with renowned musicians such as Alfred Brendel and Eberhard Feltz and are ensemble-in-residence at the Reina Sofia International Institute of Chamber Music. In the coming year, they will perform at Wigmore Hall, King's Place, and festivals in West Cork and Kuhmo. with tours in the U.S. and China in the fall of 2025.

Journey through beloved French chamber music, featuring Lili Boulanger's revolutionary songs depicting evening twilight and the vibrant evocation of spring, Debussy's intimate portrayal of the sea, and culminating in Ravel's Piano Trio inspired by Basque rhythms, his fascination with nature and exotic landscapes - all in honor of his 150th birthday.

Franz Schubert Piano Trio in E-flat major, No. 2 op. 100 ('45)

"Sun is Setting" evokes the haunting beauty of the Swedish folk song, Se solen sjunker, a melody that profoundly influenced Schubert's E-flat Trio. This program explores the varied echoes of that Swedish inspiration. Andrea Tarrodi's Akacia captures the ethereal light of the archipelago. Although not explicitly Swedish, Haydn's "Gypsy Rondo" reflects a broader fascination with folk music and its vibrant energy, leading us to Schubert, whose trio transforms the simple Swedish melody into a timeless masterpiece.
